Forklift License Kitchener - Obtaining a forklift certification or forklift license in North America would require the trainee to carry out classroom instruction in addition to hands-on training. The provincial, federal and state regulatory bodies are responsible for the certification, training and licensing for powered industrial truck operators. Operators may obtain a license either through training administered by the employer or by a third party. Regardless, regulatory requirements should be met. Recertification is necessary every two to three years.

The lift truck is a powered industrial machinery that is designed along with many options, like for instance sit-down and stand-up models, electric and propane versions, and various sizes and types to meet the industrial needs of workers. Operator training courses are normally individualized to address the particular uses and kinds for which the operator is training. Training on a gas-powered, sit-down forklift in a warehouse setting would not be the same as training on a stand-up, propane-powered forklift in a shipyard. The various forklifts and their uses makes it impossible to establish universal licensing requirements for all machinery and businesses. Regulatory standards, thus, have a tendency not to concentrate on detailed course requirements but instead on the results of individual training programs.

On the job training which is supplied by the employer is the most common form of forklift training certification and licensing. The employer who provides this method of certification is required to provide classroom sessions and practical training on machines at their place of work. Employers could choose to train employees on every kind of forklift separately, or to train them on all machinery combined. The program incorporates forklift operation methods, lift truck maintenance, safety procedures and company regulations. Subject matters specific to the worksite, such as hazardous materials or conditions, should be covered. Following classroom learning, operators are taught how to safely use and operate every type of lift truck on the worksite.

When making use of a third party trainer, the certification process will typically consist of an on-site component along with hands-on practice.

It must be noted that certifications provided by an employer do not transfer from one employer to the next. Acquiring a forklift license through employer-provided training enables the operator to run a lift truck for that employer only.

The most significant aspect of forklift license training is forklift safety. The exact safety training requirements differ from one kind of machine to another. Safety problems differ from industry to industry and from employer to employer. Both employer-provided training and third-party providers might have to deal with extra requirements for safety training in applicable businesses, like for instance in offshore and marine operations.
